Program Description & Objectives

The mission of the COPD Foundation is to develop and support programs, which improve the quality of life through research, education, early diagnosis, and enhanced therapy for persons whose lives are impacted by Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease. In keeping with that mission the October 27th event aims to bring together for the first time in the tri-state region people with COPD, their family members, the healthcare providers who care for them or are actively involved in COPD research, and representatives of government and industry. This event will include a patient and family Education Day and a CME event for healthcare providers. The latter will include participants from many of the major medical institutions in New York City and throughout the region. The Planning Committees for both the CME component and the patient/family Education Day, in keeping with the multi-center nature of the event, includes representatives from many of these institutions.

The two events will run concurrently in the morning. In the afternoon the two groups, patients with family members and healthcare providers will join together to hear from a selection of speakers with regional and national reputations. The CME event will include a poster session with abstracts of COPD research from across the region.
