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#### **MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION**

Please use 12-point type with 1-inch (2.5 cm) margins. Use double spacing throughout. All papers should be organized to include: title page, abstract, text, acknowledgments, declaration of interest, references, figure legends, tables, and figures. Each of the preceding elements should begin on a separate page. Pages should be numbered consecutively, beginning with the abstract.

**Title Page**. The title page should include a concise and descriptive title; the first name, middle initial, and last name of each author; the departmental and institutional affiliation of each author; and the telephone number as well as the email address of the corresponding author. A running title of no more than 50 characters (including characters and spaces) should be included.

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**Acknowledgments.** Acknowledgments should be grouped into one paragraph and placed after the discussion section.

**Declaration of Interest.** Disclose any real or apparent conflicts of interest including financial and consulting relationships. Disclose, if necessary, writing assistance using an agency or freelance writer.

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**References.** References should be typed double-spaced beginning on a separate sheet and numbered in the order that they appear in the text. Give all authors' names (*i.e.*, do not use "*et al.*"), complete article titles, and inclusive page numbers. Abbreviate the titles of journals according to the style used in Index Medicus.
