First and Foremost...



- Patients and their caregivers have *unique experiences* that others can learn from—experiences that researchers may not have
- The patient and caregiver perspective is distinctive and important
- Patients are experts on their own health
- The patient/caregiver perspective <u>can</u> and <u>should</u>
 <u>be</u> a part of research studies



Purpose of Training

- Prepare people with COPD and their caregivers to be active members of the research team during all phases of research
- Train people with COPD and their caregivers to become research investigators
- Ensure that patients have an active role on studies
- Increase number of people, who have COPD, and their caregivers who are prepared to be research investigators on research teams
