The COPD Foundation is gathering a multidisciplinary group of experts in Washington, DC and across the country via live video stream to discuss challenges, share best practices, and create solutions to alleviate the burden of COPD hospital readmissions. The inaugural summit -- held October 2013 -- examined the extent of the problem and why readmissions occur; the 2nd COPD Readmissions Summit aims to build on that conversation by identifying best practice solutions. The Summit will address all phases within the COPD patient care sphere: acute care and admission, evidence-based treatment, continuity of care, discharge, follow-up, and at-home and long-term care.

Participants, who represent a variety of disciplines, will seek to align on issues that have the potential to impact readmission rates for COPD.

The 2nd COPD Readmissions Summit differentiates itself in that it is designed to encourage voices from all disciplines to actively participate in consensus discussions to create cutting-edge, actionable strategies.

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HOW DOES VIDEO STREAM PARTICIPATION WORK?

Live video stream is more than just a webinar or a conference call. Participants will be able to see and hear exactly what those in the audience are hearing. A professional film crew and a technician will be onsite to ensure a seamless viewing experience. During the scheduled breakout sessions, video stream participants will have a chance to form their own virtual discussion group to ensure that your voices are captured as part of the consensus building process.

Individuals interested in participating via video should visit the COPD Foundation's website prior to registering to view the test Livestream link on the same computer that you will use on the day of the Summit to ensure that there are no problems accessing the video stream from the browser and network you are on or to be able to troubleshoot in advance if firewalls in your workplace may block the feed.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Registration for the two full days of the live video stream is \$250.

Worried you won't be able to watch all two days? Each registrant will receive a code to access the full archives of the meeting at your convenience after the Summit is concluded.

The registration fee covers one access point; you are welcome to arrange for viewing in a conference room to facilitate additional viewers within one registration. Dr. Wright is the Vice President of Innovation for the Carolinas HealthCare System (CHS). In her current role, Dr. Wright leads the advancement of innovation initiatives throughout CHS by overseeing projects that provide innovative approaches to disease surveillance, management of chronic disease, sharing of health information, enhancing the ability of case managers to work more effectively with patients and providers, and novel ways to virtually connect with patients and providers. Dr. Wright

was also a leader of the Office of the National Coordinator (ONC) Beacon Community Beacon Nation program in the Charlotte area, which focused on how to improve hospital transitions and reduce preventable readmissions. At the peak of implementation, this program saw reduction in COPD readmission rates from 15 percent to 10 percent.

Dr. Wright will be presenting how innovative products and processes can transform the COPD patient care continuum and ultimately reduce readmissions. Dr. Wright's extensive experience in this space will give attendees a unique insight into what the future of patient care will look like.
